

King Bharat is a Deer

freight

►noun

- Goods to be transported, e.g. *There is a lot of freight on this ship; The freight on this ship is bound for India; Ships that carry freight are called 'freighters'.*



weight

►noun

1. The amount of heaviness; the amount a thing weighs, e.g. *She felt she had put on a lot of weight; What is the weight of these vegetables?*
2. An object used to measure the weight of other objects, e.g. *Please put a one kilo weight on the scale, then we can see if the vegetables are more than one kilo or less.*
3. (weights) Heavy objects used for exercise or competition, e.g. *He lifts weights for exercise; In the Olympics, there is a sport called 'Weight Lifting'.*



eight

►noun / adjective

- A number, (seven plus one), e.g. *I have eight sisters.*



eighty

►noun

- A number, $79 + 1 = 80$, e.g. *Her grandmother is turning eighty.*

weigh

►verb [weigh, weighing, weighed]

- To measure the weight of something, e.g. *Please weigh the potatoes; When was the last time you weighed yourself? I weighed myself yesterday and found that I had put on weight.*
- To be a certain weight, e.g. *How much do you weigh?; I weigh 68 kilograms.*



sleigh

►noun

- A horse-drawn carriage to take people over snow or ice, e.g. *They pulled the sleigh up the mountain.*



Neighbour (also spelled 'neighbor')

►noun

- A person who lives near another, e.g. *She had invited her neighbours for dinner; We live in the same colony, he is my neighbour.*



straight

►adjective

- Without a bend, angle, or curve, e.g. *This is a straight road.*

►adverb

Directly, e.g. *Please go straight to school, do not stop anywhere on the way.*



beige

►noun

- Very light brown; tan, e.g. *She was wearing beige shoes; She painted her bedroom beige.*



veil

►noun

- A cloth worn on the face, e.g. *She wore a veil on her wedding day; She used her sari as a veil.*



leisure

►noun

- Freedom from work, relaxing, e.g. *She looked forward to retirement and a life of leisure; What do you do in your leisure time? I do not have the leisure to read.*





deity

► noun (plural 'deities')

- A god or goddess on an altar, e.g. *Their was a beautiful deity in the temple; At ISKCON Vrindavan, there are dieties of Radha-Krishna, Gaura-Nitai and Krishna-Balaram.*



weird

► adjective

- Strange; unusual, e.g. *She has weird hair; His moustache is weird; There was a weird sound coming from the room; She is a weird girl, I don't like her too much.*

protein

► noun

- Chemicals in food that help the body to grow and repair, e.g. *We get protein from dahl and milk; Protein is very important for growing children.*

other

► adjective

- Additional or further, e.g. *He and one other person are coming; Do you have any other friends?*

another

► adjective

- One more, additional, e.g. *She had another piece of cake; This pen doesn't work, do you have another one?*

brother

► noun

- A male with both parents in common, e.g. *They are brothers; He has two older brothers; Do you have any brothers? What is your brother's name? Do you know my brother?*





mother

►noun

- A female parent; *e.g. She is my mother.*

care

►verb [**care, caring, cared**]

- To be kind and loving towards; to be worried about, *e.g. She cares about cows; Krishna cares for His devotees; He doesn't care about me; Mothers love and care for their babies; I do not care whether you come or not.*

bare

►adjective

- Without covering or clothing, naked, nude, *e.g. Her legs are bare.*



dare

►verb [**dare, daring, dared**]

- To have the necessary courage or boldness for something, *e.g. She dared her to steal the biscuits; How dare you speak to me as if I were a child?*

►adjective (**daring**)

- *e.g. He is a very daring boy; It was daring of him to tickle his father's nose with a feather; Have you every done anything daring?*

fare

►noun

- The price of a ticket on a bus, train, airplane, or other public transport, *e.g. They paid the train fare at the station; How much is the bus fare from Delhi to Agra?*



hare

►noun

- A big rabbit that lives in Britain, *e.g. They saw a hare in the forest; Hares like to eat grass.*





share

►verb [share, sharing, shared]

- To give part of something to another, or use at the same time, *e.g. Teddy bear shared his ice cream with the dog; Would you mind sharing this seat with me? Sisters and brothers should share their toys.*

►noun

- A part or portion of a larger amount, *e.g. Don't fight, you will get your share; My share of my parents property is smaller than my brother's share because he is older.*



scare

►verb [scare, scaring, scared]

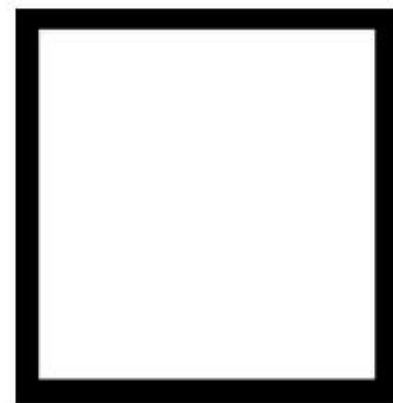
- To fill with fear or terror, frighten, alarm, *e.g. The snake scared him; She was scared of the dark; I got scared when she said that she was in an accident; Lets hide behind the door then jump out suddenly to scare him; Mice are scared of cats.*

square

►noun / adjective

- A rectangle having all four sides of equal

length, *e.g. Her room was square; Is your house square or rectangular? This is a square desk.*



careful

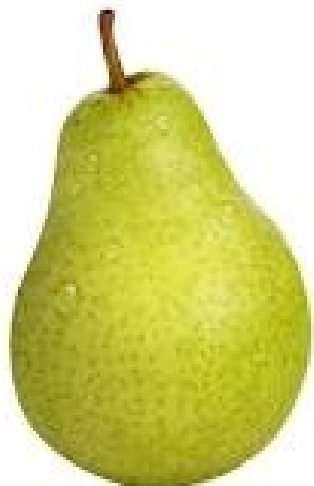
►adjective

- To be cautious; to act safely, *e.g. Be careful crossing the road; Be careful that you don't slip; He crashed his cycle because he was not being careful; We should always be careful and watchful.*

bear

►noun

- A big hairy animal found in forests , *e.g. They saw a bear in the forest; Seeing a bear is enough to scare anyone!*



pear

►noun

- A sweet fruit, usually green or brown with small seeds inside, *e.g. Pears are my favourite fruit; I had a pear for morning snack.*

tear (sounds different from 'tear' in 'tear drop')

►verb [**tear, tearing, torn**]

- To rip something, *e.g. Please tear this paper in half; Can I please have a new piece of paper, this one is torn.*

►noun

- A rip in something, *e.g. There is a tear in my dress.*

wear

►verb [**wear, wearing, worn**]

1. To use as a body covering, *e.g. She was wearing a brand new coat; Please wear this lab coat; You should wear gloves, otherwise your hands will get cold; This sweater is not new, someone has worn it before.*

►adjective (**worn**)

- Old; used, *e.g. These shoes are old and worn.*
