

Krishna's Pot

dad

► noun

- An informal form of father, e.g. *This man is my dad; What is your dad's name?*

sad

► adjective (**sadder, saddest**)

- Feeling sorrow; unhappy, e.g. *Today I am feeling sad. Why are you sad today? Are you feeling sad? I am sad about losing my dog.*



mad

► adjective (**madder, maddest**)

1. Mentally ill; insane, e.g. *Our dog caught rabies and went mad; People who drink too much alcohol can go mad.*
2. Very angry, e.g. *I didn't mean to break your cup, please don't be mad; Mum is getting mad at us for making too much noise; My father is always getting mad at me; I am mad at you.*



3. very enthusiastic about something e.g. *He's football-mad; He is mad about cricket*



pad

► noun

1. A thick flat object used for protection, e.g. *When he plays cricket, he wears shin pads; If you wear shin pads, you will not get hurt by the ball.*
2. Several sheets of paper fastened together, used for writing or drawing, e.g. *Please write a note on my pad; This is a note-pad.*



kid

► noun

1. Child, e.g. *There are lots of kids at my school; Do you remember when you were a kid? Do you have kids?*
2. Baby goat, e.g. *This is a photo of a goat and her kid.*

► verb (**kid, kidding, past kidded**)

- [colloquial] To deceive, pretend, be joking, e.g. *Stop kidding around; Are you kidding? He kids around with me all the time.*



did (past of do)

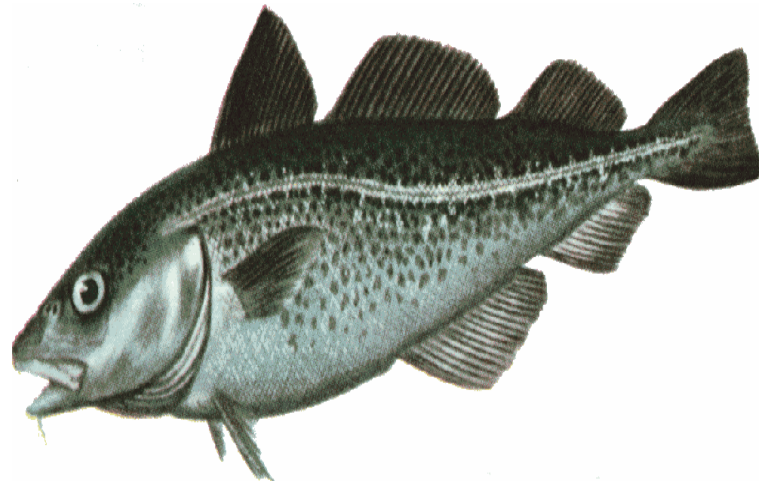
►verb (**does, doing, past did, past part. done**)

1. To perform an activity, e.g. *He said that I didn't dance yesterday but I did! He did it, I didn't do it!*
2. To finish or complete something, e.g. *I did my homework!*

cod

► noun

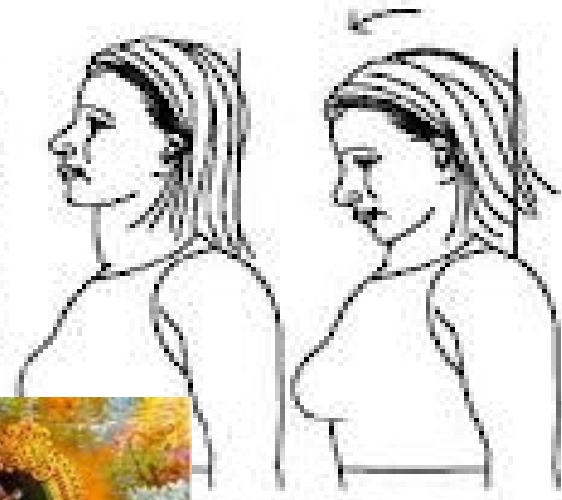
- A type of large fish, e.g. *Did you see the cod swimming in the river? The cod is a type of fish.*



nod

►verb (**nod, nodding, past nodded**)

- To make a quick, downward movement of the head (usually a sign of greeting or agreement), e.g. *Nod your head if you agree.*



God

► noun

The supreme being, e.g. *Join your hands and pray to God.*



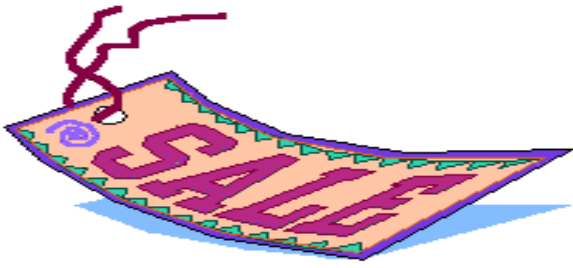
tag

► noun

1. A small card that is fastened to something; a label,
e.g. The tag was sticking out of her shirt; Please look at the price tag and tell me how

much it costs; Look at the name tag and tell me whose bag it is.

2. A game where children chase after each other,
e.g. The children were playing tag in the park.



gag

► noun

- Something to put over the mouth of someone to stop him from speaking or making noise, *e.g. She*

had a gag on her mouth.

► verb (gag, gagging, past gagged)

1. To put a gag on someone, *e.g. The thief gagged the customers so that they would not scream.*
2. To choke or be unable to swallow something, *e.g. The medicine was so bitter that it made him gag.*



nag

► verb (nag, nagging, past nagged)

1. To continually ask for something, *e.g. The child was nagging his mother to buy him some toys. He was saying "Pleeease Mummy, Pleeease..."*
2. Never giving someone rest; a continuing pain, *e.g. Her broken arm was giving her a nagging pain; I have a nagging pain in my tooth.*





sag

► verb

- To hang down or bend in the middle, especially because of the weight of something, *e.g. There are too many books on the shelf, it is starting to sag; After the rain, the roof started to sag.*

gig

► noun

- A live performance by a musician or band, *e.g. We went to a gig last night.*

pig

► noun

- An animal that is usually fat and eats a lot, *e.g. There was a pig sitting in the mud eating garbage.*



dig

► verb [dig, digging, dug]

- To make a hole in the ground, *e.g. We are digging a hole to plant the tree; Please dig a hole here.*



dog

► noun

- A domestic animal, *e.g. This is my pet dog; Do you like dogs?*



can

► noun

- A metal container for holding food, liquid etc, e.g. *I want a can of ice tea. Do you have this drink in a can? Don't tip the paint can.*

► verb (**can**, past **could**)

- To have permission, e.g. *You*

can go home now; Can I go to my friends house? You can go to your friend's house.

► interrogative pronoun

- Used to ask about possibility or permission, e.g. *Can*

I come in? Can I help you? Can you walk?

man

► noun (pl. **men**)

- An adult human male, e.g. *Did you see the man wearing the orange hat? Was it a man or a woman?*



pan

► noun

- A large flat object for cooking food in, e.g. *I cooked the vegetables in the pan; I made a paratha on a small frying pan.*



tan

► noun

1. Skin colour, e.g. *Westerners have lightly tanned skin, Indian skin is usually a slightly darker shade of tan; I like tan coloured clothes.*
2. The colour of pale-skinned people after staying in the sun, e.g. *You are getting a tan from working in the sun.*

► verb [**tans**, **tanning**, **tanned**]

- To become darker, e.g. *When I go in the sun, my skin tans.*

► adjective

- A yellowish-brown colour e.g. *He has lightly tanned skin.*

in

► preposition

1. To be at a place, condition, or quality, e.g. *I'm in bed; I'm in a bad situation; I'm in class.*
2. Expressing inclusion or involvement, e.g. *I'm in the Special English Class!*

► adverb

- Expressing arrival or time, e.g. *I will be there in 5 minutes; Class will start in 10 minutes.*





tin

►noun

1. A sealed metal container, *e.g. Please open the tin; The paint tin is in the corner.*
2. Metal used as a roof, *e.g. The house has a tin roof.*

►adjective (tinned)

1. In a tin, *e.g. Tinned food is not as good as fresh food; Have you got any tinned tomatoes.*



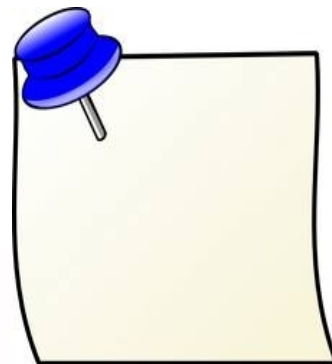
pin

►noun

- A thin piece of metal with a sharp point at one end and a round head at the other, used for fastening pieces of cloth, paper, etc.
e.g. My button has fallen off, do you have a safety pin? Please put some pins in this cloth.

►verb [pin, pinning, pinned]

- To stick something together using pins, *e.g. Please pin this notice on the*



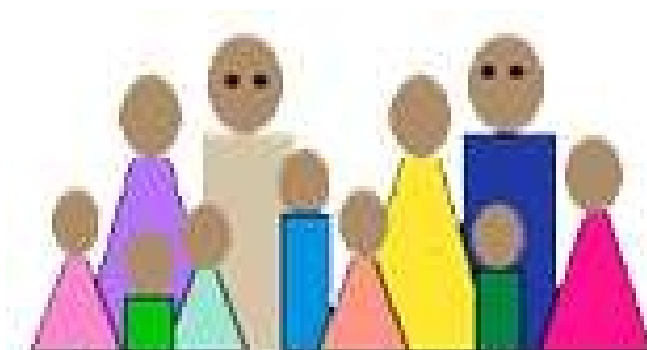
notice board; Please pin this poster on the wall; Please pin up your hair; Please pin these papers together.



kin

► noun [rarely used]

- Relatives, family members,
e.g. All of the people in this room are my kin.



at

►preposition

1. To arrive or be in a place, *e.g. I'm at the temple.*
2. The time when an event starts, *e.g. School begins at 9; Lunch is at noon.*

cat

► noun

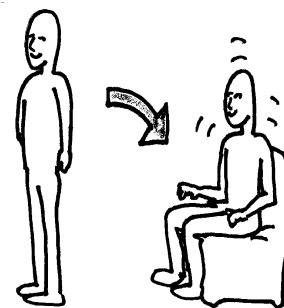
- A small animal that drinks milk and eats mice,
e.g. A black cat came into our house and tipped over the milk.



sat

►verb [sits, sitting, sat]

- To put the weight of the body on the buttocks, e.g. Yesterday I sat on **that** chair, today I want to sit on this one; When we went to the temple the temple, we sat at the front; I was not happy because he sat on my chair.



pat

►verb [pats, patting, patted]

- To touch quickly and gently with the palm of the hand, e.g. Would you like to pat my dog? Her mother gave her a pat on the back for her good work.



mat

►noun

- A cloth on the ground for sitting, e.g. The cat sat on the mat; please wipe your feet on the doormat.

it

►pronoun [third person singular]

- A subject in statements about time, distance, or weather, e.g. It's lunch time; Where is the temple? It is on the left; Oh no, it is raining
- Used to refer to a thing previously mentioned or easily identified, e.g. Give me the pen! I need it!



pit

►noun

- A large hole in the ground or a hollow or indentation in a surface, e.g. When he was walking to school, he fell in the pit; Men have dug a pit in front of my house.

sit

►verb [sit, sitting, sat]

- To put the weight of the body on the buttocks, e.g. Please sit down; Where do you want to sit?



kit

►noun

- A set of tools, materials, clothes or equipment for a particular purpose e.g. Have you seen my tool kit? His hand is bleeding, do you have a first aid kit?



got

► verb [get, getting, got]

1. To obtain, earn, buy, *e.g. Where did you buy your dress? I got it at that shop.*
2. To receive, *e.g. I got your letter today.*
3. To become, *e.g. He got mad when he saw me; I got sick from dancing in the rain.*
4. To go, come arrive, travel, *e.g. We got there at 10 o'clock.*

not

► adverb

- 1. Used to express the negative, *e.g. I am tall but you are not.*
e.g. You can not go; do you think it will rain? I hope not; It does not get angry very often.

pot

► noun

- A round container used to cook, *e.g. Mum was heating the milk in a pot; The pot is hot; Is there any tea in the teapot?*



cot

► noun

- A crib; a bed for babies, with bars on the side to keep the baby from falling out, *e.g. The baby was sleeping in the cot.*



map

► noun

- A picture of a country or area, *e.g. This is a map of India; Can you show me where Delhi is on the map?*





nap

► noun

- A short sleep, especially during the day, *e.g. The baby is taking a nap; Why don't you have a nap?*

► verb (**naps, napping, past napped**)

- To sleep lightly, *e.g. He is napping; He naps every day at 2pm.*



tap

► noun

- Something water comes out of, *e.g. Please turn off the tap; Turn on the tap and fill the bucket with water.*

► verb (**taps, tapping, past tapped**)

1. To touch someone with a finger, *e.g. He tapped me on the shoulder.*
2. To touch a foot or finger a hard surface in order to make

a noise, *e.g. He was tapping his foot to the tune of the song.*



cap

► noun

1. A type of hat, *e.g. He was wearing a cap.*
2. The top of a tube, a pen, a bottle etc, *e.g. Put the cap on the pen or it will dry out.*



gap

► noun

- An opening, space between, way through, *e.g. He fell into the gap; He has a gap in between his teeth.*



mop

► noun

- A bundle of strings or a cloth e at the end of a small pole used for cleaning floors, *e.g. Please bring the mop and the bucket.*

► verb [**mop, mopping, mopped**]

- To wipe the floor with a wet cloth or mop, *e.g. She is mopping the floor; Have you mopped the floor yet? Please mop the floor now.*



top

► noun

1. The highest part, *e.g. I am at the top of the mountain.*
2. The most important or best, *e.g. He has the top job in the company; He is our top salesperson; He got the top mark on the exam (highest mark).*
3. The upper part of something, *e.g. There is a bird sitting on top of her head.*

► verb [top, topping, topped]

- To come first, *e.g. He is always topping the class; Last year, he topped the class.*



cop

► noun [colloquial]

- A policeman, *e.g. The cop says; "Stop!"; My dad is a cop.*



pop

► verb [pop, popping, popped]

- To make a short, sharp sound, *e.g. The balloon popped; Did you hear that popping sound? Don't pop my balloon.*

► noun

- A type of modern music, *e.g. He likes pop music.*



gas

► noun

1. Matter like air, *e.g. Our gas finished in the middle of cooking; The balloon was filled with special gas so that it floated in the sky.*
2. Wind passed from body, *e.g. After eating too much I had pain in my stomach from gas.*
3. (*in the US*) short form for gasoline, *e.g. The car is out of gas.*



am

► verb [be, being, was]

- To exist; happen, *e.g. I am a human being; I am hungry; I am coming; I am 11 years old.*

Sam

► proper noun

- A person's name (male or female)
