mould


▶noun

• A frame that makes a shape, e.g. I poured the sugar into the sugar mould and made an angel shape.

mold

noun

• A growth on walls or food from dampness, e.g. There was black mold on the outside of the building.



shoulder

▶noun

• The place on the body where arms connect to the trunk, e.g. I hurt my shoulder playing tennis.

boulder

▶noun

• A large rock, e.g. The boulder rolled down the mountain.

soul

>noun

• The spiritual matter inside a physical body, e.g. It is our duty to work so that our soul goes back to Krishna when we die.



four

>noun

• A cardinal number, three plus one, e.g. He was four blocks away; I will come in four minutes.

fourth

▶ The ordinal number for four, e.g. The appointment was on the 4^{th} of July; This is the fourth time you have told me that story.



court

>noun

- 1. A place where hearing and determination of law cases, *e.g.* They had to go to court for the murder hearing.
- 2. An area for playing games etc, e.g. We have a basketball court at out school.



course

▶noun

- 1. A unit of study, e.g. I want to take a course in Yoga.
- 2. The medicine needed for an illness, *e.g. I took a course of antibiotics*.
- 3. A track for racing, e.g. The racing cars were racing on the race course; The horses were racing on the race course.



▶verb [pour, pouring, poured]

• To make liquid move from one container to another, e.g. He is pouring the juice from the jug to the cup; Can you please pour a glass of milk for me?

your

▶pronoun

• Belonging to you, *e.g.* Your jacket is in the closet.

could

▶modal

- 1. Might, possibly, e.g. You could do it if you tried; It could rain this evening; Take your jacket, otherwise you could get sick.
- 2. Question word, e.g. Could you please pass me the salt? Could you please tell me the time?



would

▶modal

- 1. Expresses the possibility of doing something, e.g. He said he would go tomorrow; I would have gone to town but it was raining so I didn't.
- 2. Question word, e.g. Would you like a biscuit? Would you mind if I left a bit early today?

should

▶modal

• Something that is necessary, or important, e.g. I should go to see my mother in the hospital today; I should have told him yesterday, but I forgot.

couldn't

▶modal

• Contraction of 'could not', e.g. Sorry that I couldn't come to your house yesterday, I was very busy.

wouldn't

▶modal

• Contraction of 'would not', e.g. We told him to go home but he wouldn't leave the school.

shouldn't

▶modal

• Contraction of 'should not', e.g. I shouldn't have told him that the whether is bad, now he won't come; Shouldn't we go now?

you

▶pronoun

• One, anyone, people in general, e.g. This package came for you; This is for you on your birthday.

soup

▶noun

 A liquid food made by boiling or simmering vegetables with various added ingredients,

e.g. I love drinking soup in winter; Do you like tomato soup?

group

▶noun

 Any collection or assemblage of persons or things, e.g. Please take a photo of our tour group; A large group of Russian devotees came to the temple last night.





enormous

adjective

• Greatly exceeding the normal size, e.g. This enormous pumpkin grew on our farm; He has an enormous house and

two cars.



tremendous

▶adjective

- 1. Excellent, e.g. Tremendous! Fantastic! Wow! If Krishna came to earth right now, wouldn't that be tremendous?
- 2. More than usual, *e.g.* He has tremendous talent.

jealous

▶adjective

• Feeling resentful or angry at someone who has something you don't, e.g. The gopis are jealous of Radha Rani because they know that Krishna loves her the most; He is jealous of his rich brother.





previous

▶adjective

• Coming or occurring before something else, prior, e.g. The previous owner of this car was a woman.

young

▶adjective

• Being in the first or early stage of life or growth, youthful, not old, e.g. Only young girls can attend Sandipani Muni School; This is a photo of me when I was young.

couple

▶noun

- 1. A few, an unknown number, 2, 3 or 4, e.g. I am going away for a couple of days.
- 2. A man and woman who are in a relationship, e.g. Radha Rani and Krishna are the perfect couple; Three married couples came to my house for dinner.

animal

▶noun

• Living creatures that move around, e.g. There were lots of animals at the zoo; She loves animals so she has several pets.

hospital

▶noun

• An institution where sick or injured persons are given medical treatment, *e.g.* He was in hospital with a broken arm; I went to the hospital to visit my mother.

several

▶adjective

• More than two, e.g. Several children wanted to go to the museum; He was sick for several days last week.

although

▶conjunction

• Something different than expected; despite the fact that, e.g. Although it was cold, he went to the temple; Although it was winter, it was quite warm
