

The Hunter and the Sage



earth
▶ noun

1. The planet we live on, *e.g. The earth is our mother.*
2. Soil, dirt, *e.g. There was a mound of earth in front of the building.*



heard

▶ verb [hear, hearing, heard]

- To perceive by the ear, *e.g. I heard she is going to the temple today; Have you ever heard the story about Krishna and Bakasura?*



pearl
▶ noun

- A small white jewel found inside the shell of a sea creature, *e.g. She brought a brand new pearl necklace.*

learn

▶ verb [learn, learning, learnt]

- To acquire knowledge of or skill, by study, instruction or experience, *e.g. She is learning French; Where did you learn to speak Hindi? I learnt how to speak Hindi in Vrindavan.*

early

▶ adjective

- 1) Happening or done before the usual or expected time, *e.g. The bus came early so I missed it; We ate an early lunch.*
- 2) Happening, belonging to, or done near the beginning of a particular time, *e.g. An early goal in the game secured our victory.*

▶ adverb

- 1) Before the usual or expected time, *e.g. I was planning to finish work early today.*
- 2) Near the beginning of a particular time or period, *e.g. We lost a couple of games early in the season.*

search

▶ verb [search, searching, searched]

- To look carefully in order to find something missing or lost, *e.g. They searched the woods for the missing child.*



love

►verb [love, loving, loved]

- Affection; caring, e.g. *Radha loves Krishna; She loves her mum; Mothers always love their children, even if they are naughty; How can we show love for Krishna?*



dove

►noun

- A white bird, e.g. *The dove's flew in the sky; Doves are a symbol of peace.*

glove

►noun

- A covering for the hand, e.g.

The doctor put on a pair of gloves before he touched the patient; My hands get cold when I ride my bike, so I wear gloves.



above

►adverb

- In a higher place, e.g. *The plane is flying above the ocean; They sat above the stage*

finger

►noun

- The digits of the hand, e.g. *She put a ring on her finger; I have ten fingers and ten toes.*



anger

►Noun

- A strong feeling of annoyance and unhappiness, e.g. *The father displayed anger towards his disobedient daughter.*

►Verb [anger, angered]

- To fill with anger or to provoke anger in, e.g. *She was angered by his short answer.*





hunger

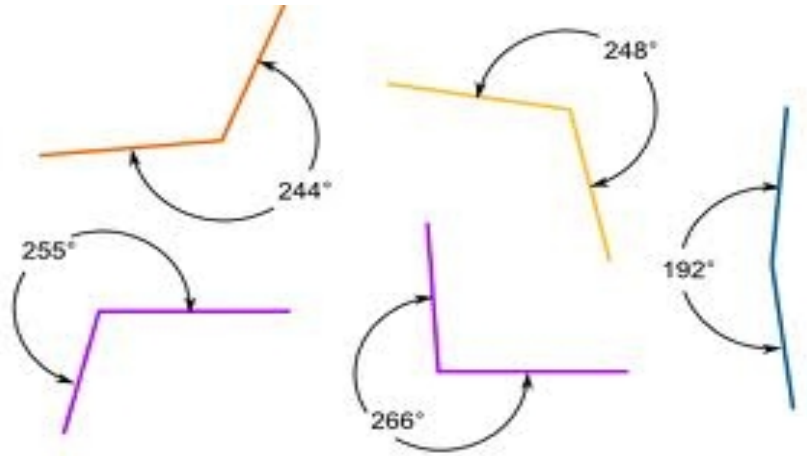
► noun

- A need or want for food, *e.g. I have hunger pains in my stomach.*

angle

► noun

1. A measurement for corners, *e.g. We learnt how to measure angles in maths.*



mangle

► verb [**mangle**, mangling, mangled]

- To crush or break, *e.g. The dog mangled the sofa; The car door got mangled in the accident.*

bangle

► noun

- A thick bracelet, *e.g. She wore red bangles.*



tangle

► adjective / noun

- Twisted threads, *e.g. The string is tangled; He hair was in a tangled mess; Use a comb to get the tangles out of your hair.*

dangle

►verb [**dangle, dangling, dangled**]

- To hang loosely, *e.g. The lights dangled from the roof.*

rectangle

►noun

- A shape with four right angles, *e.g. This sentence is inside a rectangle; I drew a rectangle, a square and a triangle.*



jingle

►verb [**jingle, jingling, jingled**]

- To make clinking or tinkling sounds, *e.g. His keys jingled in his pocket; The coins in his pockets were jingling.*

tingle

►verb [**tingle, tingling, tingled**]

- To have a strange feeling like needles on the skin, *e.g. My shoes were too tight so my foot started tingling.*

single

►adjective

- Only one in number; Not married, *e.g. There was a single piece of cake left; I am not married, I am single; I ordered a single scoop of ice cream, not a double scoop.*

jungle

►noun

- A thick forest, with vines and creepers, *e.g. Tigers live in the jungle.*



bungle

►verb [**bungle, bungled, bungling**]

- To do clumsily and awkwardly, *e.g. He bungled the job; Don't talk to me when I am working, otherwise I will bungle the work.*

angel

►noun

- Spiritual beings in the Christian religion who bring messages and protect people, *e.g. The angels were dressed in white; My daughter is so well behaved, she is a little angel.*
