find

▶ verb [find, finding, found]

• To locate or obtain by search or effort, e.g. I am looking in my bag because I am trying to find my keys; Krishna was hiding and the Gopis were trying to find him.



kind

- ▶ adjective
 - To have a good nature; to be nice, e.g. Anuradha is kind to her grandmother; We should always be kind to others; She is a kind girl.

mind

▶ noun

1. The brain, e.g. If Lalita uses her mind during the test she will do very well; My mind was disturbed by the movie.

2. To be disturbed, e.g. Would you mind if I sit here? No one will mind if you come a little late.

behind

▶ preposition

• To be at the back of someone or something, *e.g.* The child is behind the fence; Please stand behind the line.

remind

▶verb [remind, reminding, reminded]

• To cause a person to remember something, e.g. Remind me to come to class early tomorrow; Remind me to give back your pencil.



blind

➤ adjective

• Unable to see *e.g.* I helped the blind man cross the road.







grind

▶ verb [grind, grinding, grinded]

To rub harshly to make something into smaller pieces; to grate, e.g. Use the stone to grind the ginger into a paste.

wind

▶ noun

• To turn a handle, *e.g If you wind up the toy dog it will run*.

pint

▶ noun

A measurement (around half a litre), e.g. My mom asked me to bring home a pint of milk.

mild

▶ adjective

- 1. Not too sweet or hot; a light taste, e.g. Plain chips have a mild flavor.
- 2. Gentleness e.g. The principal had a mild voice; He is a mild and gentle man; He only gave me a mild punishment.

wild

▶ adjective

• Animals that are from the jungle or people that act like they are from the jungle, *e.g.* These are all wild animals; The wild monkey stole my bananas; She is a wild and crazy girl.



• The jungle, e.g. Animals should live in the wild, they should not be kept in zoos.



→ noun

• A young person; a kid, e.g. The child would not stop crying; She is a sweet child.





lion

A large wildcat that lives in the jungle, e.g. The lion looked scary.



dandelion

▶ noun

A plant that has green leaves and golden yellow flowers, e.g. I saw a dandelion in the grass.

tiger

noun

A large wildcat, like a lion but with black stripes, e.g. The tiger roared at me.



spider

• noun

• An eight legged bug that spins webs that trap for prey, e.g. The spider spun a web on the corner of the window.



pilot

The officer who operates an airplane and flies it, e.g. "I saw the pilot as I boarded the plane."

ought

▶ noun

Should, e.g. "I ought to study for the test tomorrow."



thought

▶ verb [think, thinking, thought]

• Simple past and past participle of 'think'; Mental activity, *e.g. He thought about what he would do when got home from school.*



bought 「☐☐//▶verb [buy, buying, bought]

Simple past and past participle of 'buy'; to take something after giving money, e.g. He bought a cold drink at the store.



fought

▶ verb [fight, fighting, fought]

• Simple past and past participle of 'fight'; an angry argument or battle, e.g. Madu-Priya fought with her sister over which TV channel to watch.



brought

▶ verb [bring, bringing, brought]

• Simple past and past tense of 'bring'; to carry something, to take something with you, e.g. Anuradha brought her new book bag to school; Eat these chips, I brought them for you.

caught

▶ verb [catch, catching, caught]

- 1. To capture something, e.g. The cat caught the mouse; I caught the ball.
- 2. To get an illness, e.g. I went out in the rain and caught the flu



taught

▶ verb [teach, teaching, taught]

• Simple past and past participle of teach; to instruct or give knowledge, e.g. *The teacher taught us the meaning of all the words on the vocabulary list*.



daughter

noun

• A female child, e.g. The woman yelled at her daughter for misbehaving; I have two sons and one daughter.

rude

►adjective

• Bad mannered, e.g. He was very rude with the waiter.

crude

▶adjective

- 1. Being in a natural state, e.g. Crude oil is found under the ground; Crude oil is refined to make petrol and plastic.
- 2. Characterized by simplicity, especially something not carefully or expertly made. *e.g. A hut is a crude shelter*.
- 3. Lacking tact or taste, e.g. He made a crude remark.

▶verb [include, including, included]


• To contain, to be together, e.g. I will purchase the book if you include a free pen; The school fees include text books (you don't have to pay extra for them); When we play a game, we should include everyone.

cube


▶noun

1. A programmable electronic device. e.g. Laptop and PC are both types of computers.



▶noun


- 1. A pipe, e.g. He was drinking the water through a

mute

▶adjective

Not able to speak; dumb *e.g* He is mute.



To make silent, e.g. Please mute the T.V; Please put the volume on mute.



▶adjective

Small or cuddly like an animals or baby, *e.g.* I want to keep this kitten, he is so cute! He is so cute when he tries to eat with a spoon.





flute ▶noun

• A musical instrument, e.g. Sri Krishna plays a flute; When Sri Krishna plays His flute, the gopis dance.



rule

▶noun

• A regulation or guideline, e.g. Wearing the uniform is one of our school rules; Don't break rules!

▶verb [rule, ruling, ruled]

• To mark paper with straight lines using a scale (ruler) e.g. He is ruling lines on the paper; Please rule a margin on the side of the page.



tune

▶noun

• A song; a melody, e.g. He was singing a tune.

►verb [tune, tuning, tuned]

• To do some work on a musical instrument or car so that it works properly, e.g. He was tuning his vena; My car is making a strange sound, I need to get it tuned up.



June

▶proper noun

1. The sixth month of the calendar, following May and preceding July.

prune

>noun

• A dried plum; a type of dried fruit, *e.g. He was eating prunes*.

▶verb [prune, pruning, pruned]

• To remove excess leaves from a plant, e.g. I need to prune my tulsi plants; He is picking off the dead leaves and pruning the plant so that it grows better.



use (long /u/ sound) ►verb [use, using, used]

• To apply; to utilize, e.g. Use this knife to slice the bread; We can use a calculator to help us do the sums.



excuse(long /u/ sound)

▶verb [excuse, excusing, excused]

- 1. To forgive; to pardon, e.g. I excused him for shouting at me; You know he shouldn't have done it, so don't try to excuse his behavior!
- 2. To allow to leave. e.g. May I be excused from the class for a few minutes?

use (short /u/ sound)

▶noun

- 1. The act of using, e.g. There is no use for books when we have television; What is the use of trying; What's the use of a law that nobody follows?
- 2. Function / purpose, e.g. This tool has many uses; List all of the different uses of a pencil.

excuse (short /u/ sound)

noun

1. A poor explanation, an unbelievable story, e.g. He gave the teacher an excuse about the dog eating her homework, but she didn't believe him; Tell me why you were late – and I don't want to hear any excuses! Forgetting the time is not a good reason for being late, it is just an excuse!
